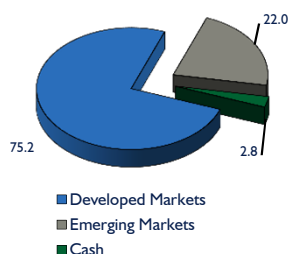

## Investment objective

The Fund's investment objective is to seek long-term growth of capital.

The Fund invests primarily in companies both in developed markets - excluding the United States ("international value portfolio") - and in emerging markets ("emerging markets portfolio"). The Investment Adviser allocates substantially all of the Fund's assets between the international value portfolio and the emerging markets portfolio using a proprietary asset allocation model.

## Fund features

- The international value portfolio uses bottom-up stock selection based on fundamental research, focusing on mid to large cap value stocks in developed international markets.
- The emerging markets portfolio uses an actively managed tracking-error oriented quantitative strategy, combining bottom-up and top-down factors in security selection.

**Market commentary**

Developed equity markets appreciated in the third quarter following signs of continuing global growth, albeit less synchronized than in 2017 as the US has outpaced other developed markets. Emerging markets equities, on the other hand, posted negative returns during the quarter as country-specific challenges and continuing trade tensions weighed on performance. The top performing markets in our investable universe included Thailand, Qatar, Poland, Switzerland, and Taiwan. The worst performing markets included Turkey, Greece, China, South Africa, and Egypt. The best performing sectors in the MSCI ACWI ex US Index ("Index") were health care, energy, and telecommunication services. The worst performing sectors were real estate, consumer discretionary, and information technology.

The Causeway International Opportunities Fund ("Fund") underperformed the Index during the quarter, due primarily to stock selection. Fund holdings in the banks, food beverage & tobacco, capital goods, telecommunication services, and utilities industry groups detracted from relative performance. Holdings in the pharmaceuticals & biotechnology, automobiles & components, transportation, consumer services, and software & services industry groups offset some of the underperformance. The largest detractor was electronic components manufacturer, Yageo Corp. (Taiwan). Additional notable detractors included online services company, Tencent Holdings Ltd. (China), British American Tobacco plc (United Kingdom), banking & financial services company, Barclays Plc (United Kingdom), and banking & financial services company, UniCredit S.p.A. (Italy). The top contributor to return was pharmaceutical & consumer healthcare products producer, Novartis AG (Switzerland). Other notable contributors included pharmaceutical company, AstraZeneca Plc (United Kingdom), rail operator, Canadian Pacific Railway (Canada), automobile manufacturer, Volkswagen AG (Germany), and paints & coatings producer, Akzo Nobel NV (Netherlands).
